RACING & SAILING RULES 2018

The Racing & Sailing Rules and Special Regulations 2018 is available to download from the **Captains' Page** on our website: www.sailtraininginternational.org/vessels/captains-page.

Race One (Liverpool to Dublin), is designated as Category 2, and Race Two (Dublin to Bordeaux) is designated as Category 1 in accordance with Rule 2.02 of the Racing and Sailing Rules 2018.

All vessels are required to have an active AIS transponder on board.

Participants are urged to make sure they study and use the current edition of the Racing & Sailing Rules and Special Regulations.

SAIL TRAINING INTERNATIONAL RULE OF RATING AND RACE PRIZES

Each registered vessel will be issued with a Rating Certificate which will be calculated by Sail Training International's unique Rule of Rating which ensures that all vessels will be able to race equally on corrected time. All new vessels to The Tall Ships Races will be provided with a Measurement Form which will need to be completed in advance.

Trophies will be awarded for first, second and third places per class on corrected time, and for first on elapsed time (line honours) and overall on corrected time for each race leg. There will be many other special prizes for competing vessels, including for the best crew in the crew parade. Vessels from all classes competing in all race legs will be eligible for the overall race series prizes.

The principal award will be the Three Festivals Tall Ships Regatta 2018 Friendship Trophy which will be awarded to the vessel which, in the opinion of the competing captains' and crews, has contributed the most to international understanding and friendship.

RACE POSITION REPORTING AND MARINE COMMUNICATIONS EQUIPMENT

For safety reasons, and to help the interest of the young crews during a race, Sail Training International organises a twice-daily radio schedule. Vessels' positions are passed over the radio and logged by the communications vessel. The corrected placings are then re-broadcast so that they may be plotted for all on board to see. Results and charts showing the fleet's positions are also posted onto the race websites at www.tallshipsraces.com.

Full Sailing and Communications Instructions are to be collected by Captains/Masters on arrival, from the Sail Training International Race Office in Liverpool for Race 1 and in Dublin for Race 2.

Radio schedules will be conducted either on MF, VHF or satellite phone. The MF frequency used will be 4146 KHz. The VHF frequency used will normally be channel 77. Any change to these frequencies will be notified in due course. Race starts are normally conducted on VHF channel 77. Please note that a VHF radio and type approved 406 MHZ EPIRB are compulsory for these races.

SATELLITE TRANSPONDERS

Sail Training International will again provide participants with a 'YellowBrick' satellite transponder for the Three Festivals Tall Ships Regatta 2018. There will be no charge to the participating vessels but the 'YellowBrick' transponder will be the responsibility of the Captain/Master until they return it to Sail Training International at the end of the last race that they participate in. Captains/Masters will need to sign to this effect.

We hope that everyone will appreciate the significant benefits that this scheme brings to vessel operators and their sponsors, as well to the crews and their family and friends ashore who wish to follow their vessel's progress.

CREW CHANGES

Vessel operators and Captains/Masters are reminded that the social programmes in each of the four ports are designed to a similar pattern [see "Draft Port Programmes"]. The main crew activities - sports, prize-giving and crew party – are usually held on the second day of the official port dates.

In order to allow a vessel's trainee crew to gain maximum benefit from the social programme and, in particular, to take part in the prize-giving and crew party which follows it, it is strongly recommended that crew changes are conducted on the third day of the official port dates.

Many vessels do this already and crew changes often take place in the very early hours of day three. Our experience is that trainees who have to leave their vessel before the prize-giving and crew party feel they are being deprived of an important part of the whole "experience" and would much prefer to have the chance to stay for those events, even if it means having to travel late at night or early in the morning. For 2018 the recommended crew change dates are:

Liverpool – Sunday 27 May; Dublin – Sunday 3 June; Bordeaux – Sunday 17 June

VESSEL LIFE SAVING APPLIANCES INSPECTIONS (rule 12.2.1)

All vessels will be required to conform to the Sail Training International Special Regulations in the Racing & Sailing Rules and Special Regulations, Current Edition. The Vessel Life Saving Appliances Report form MUST be completed prior to each race and signed by the Captain/Master and presented to the STI Race Office within 12 hours after the official start of the port event (see draft port programmes). Sail Training International will endeavour to inspect all vessels before the Race start.

VISAS

Visa Requirements for UK, IRELAND and FRANCE

Individual race entrants are responsible for ascertaining what visas or other documents will be required by their ship's company when arriving in the UK, Ireland and France, and to obtain such visas themselves. Captains/Masters should note that ships or crew originating from any EU and Schengen countries^{Note1} do not need visas to visit any of this year's ports. However, they are advised to check that individual crew members conform to this requirement. Lists of countries whose citizens do require visas can be obtained from any of the host ports.

Note 1: The Schengen countries are: Austria, Belgium, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Iceland, Italy, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, The Netherlands, Norway, Poland, Portugal, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden and Switzerland. All these countries except Norway and Iceland are European Union members.

Please be aware that Russian ships will have to contact the relevant countries' consulates since they will need visas for entering the Schengen area.

DIPLOMATIC CLEARANCE – Military Vessels

Military vessels taking part in the Regatta will need diplomatic clearance to enter foreign territorial waters. Captains/Masters of military vessels are reminded to make sure that the period of time they have applied for takes into account the possibility of their vessel finishing the Race early and arriving in port outside the published official port dates. They are also advised to ensure that they have clearance for the Cruise-in-Company area of sailing and intended visit ports.

CLASS A SHIP OPENING TIMES TO THE PUBLIC

The Tall Ships Races usually attract hundreds of thousands of visitors during the festivities in the host ports, and there is often huge interest in visiting ships. It is therefore greatly appreciated if ships would open their decks to the public.

Whilst it remains at the discretion of the Captain/Master to decide ship opening times, ports have suggested that the following times would be appropriate for ships to be opened to the public:

Liverpool Times between 1000 and 2000

Dublin Times between 1000 and 2000

Bordeaux Times between 1000 and 2000





DUBLIN BERTHING PLAN



CREW TRAVEL - LIVERPOOL: Arrival/Transfer Information

<u>Air</u> - John Lennon Airport is 9 miles from Liverpool Waterfront and City Centre, with over 80 UK and European routes. For more information visit www.liverpoolairport.com.

Manchester Airport is located 50 minutes from Liverpool City Centre and offers many direct long-haul routes into the North West. Carriers include British Airways, Emirates, KLM, Lufthansa, Hainan Airlines and Virgin Atlantic etc. For further information please visit www.manchesterairport.co.uk.

<u>Bus</u> - Regular Bus Services operate to both Liverpool Waterfront and City Centre from John Lennon Airport. **No. 500** is the most direct Airport Link to Liverpool One Bus Station, opposite Albert Dock and Liverpool Waterfront, departing from Stop 3 outside the Terminal every 30 minutes during core hours. **No. 82A** also goes to Liverpool One Bus Station from Bus Stop 3 but is not as direct.

No. 86A goes to Central Liverpool and Hanover Street, a short walk to Liverpool One and Liverpool Waterfront. This departs from Bus Stop 4 outside the Terminal and operates all day. This is convenient for Liverpool Lime Street City Centre Railway Station stop on Renshaw Street. **Nos. 500 & 86A** also link John Lennon Airport with South Parkway railway station for connections to Central Station and James Street Station in the City Centre on the Northern Line Merseyrail network. Both Stations are convenient for transfers to Liverpool Waterfront and the Albert Dock. Central Station is about a 15 minute walk to the Albert Dock, whilst James Street Station is about a 10 minute walk to the Albert Dock.

<u>Taxis</u> - John Lennon Airport has an on-site Taxi Rank and approximate transfer costs to Liverpool Waterfront or Central Liverpool are in the range of £16.00-£20.00.

Road - Liverpool City Region is well connected to UK motorways. From the M6 take the M62, M58 or M56. On approach to Liverpool follow the brown tourist signs to Liverpool Waterfront and Albert Dock.

<u>Parking</u> - Liverpool One complex located opposite Liverpool Waterfront is served by three car parks: Q-Park Stand Street has 2000 underground spaces, Q-Park Gradwell Street has 560 multi-storey spaces and Q-Park John Lewis has 580 multi-storey spaces. Limited parking at the Albert Dock on the Britannia side of the Dock is open 24 hours. For tariffs please visit www.albertdock.com/visitor-information/parking-tariffs-2/. Rail - Regular rail services UK-wide go straight to mainline City Centre Station, Liverpool Lime Street. Please visit www.nationalrail.co.uk or www.virgintrains.co.uk. Merseyrail underground services the City, Northern and Wirral lines connecting Liverpool to the Wider City Region. Please visit www.merseyrail.org. From Liverpool Lime Street to Liverpool Waterfront you can take the Wirral Line on the lower level platform to James Street Station. This service is FREE of charge with valid tickets marked "All Stations". James Street Station is located opposite Liverpool Waterfront and is approximately a 10 minute walk to the Albert Dock. There is a paid Left Luggage facility at Lime Street Station.

CREW TRAVEL - <u>DUBLIN</u>: <u>Arrival/Transfer Information</u>

<u>Air Access to Dublin</u> - Direct flights are available from most major cities in the UK and Europe and several hubs in North America, and Dubai and Abu Dhabi. Dublin Airport is 10km from the city, close to the M50 and M1 motorways, and a range of transport options connect directly with the city centre and suburbs. <u>Aircoach</u>, <u>Airlink</u> and <u>Dublin Bus</u> provide bus services from both terminals, and metered taxis are also readily available. There is currently no direct rail link between airport and city. There are also international airports in Belfast, Cork and Shannon which have good rail and bus connections.

<u>Ferry Access to Dublin</u>-Dublin Port is located two miles from the city centre, with <u>Irish Ferries</u> offering several daily cruise and fast ferry options from Holyhead. Irish Ferries Ulysses has sailings taking just under two hours. <u>Stena Line</u> operates ferries between Holyhead and Dublin Port, with four daily sailings each way. <u>The Isle of Man Steam Packet Company</u> connects the Isle of Man to Dublin, while <u>P&O Ferries</u> takes car passengers between Liverpool and Dublin (i.e. not foot passengers).

<u>Dublin Bus</u> connects Dublin Port with the city's main bus station and city centre by the number <u>53 bus</u> (fares need to be paid with coins, smart cards or pre-paid tickets) and taxis are readily available too.

<u>Train Access to Dublin</u> -<u>Iarnród Éireann</u> (Irish Rail in English), operates rail services in Ireland. The Arrow suburban rail service operates between Dublin and Kildare and the suburban rail network operates between Drogheda, Arklow, Maynooth and Dublin. Suburban rail network maps, suburban rail fare information and suburban timetables for all services are available on the Iarnród Éireann web site (<u>www.irishrail.ie</u>). Iarnród Éireann's InterCity services provide rail links between Ireland's main towns and cities.

The <u>Enterprise</u> service operates between Belfast and Dublin and is jointly run by larnród Éireann and Northern Ireland Rail. The service is aimed at all travellers; business, tourist and general rail passengers.

A good option for visitors looking to co-ordinate public transport in Ireland is <u>transportforireland.ie</u>. The website brings together service information, directions and time estimates for bus, tram and rail transport in the city.

Transport services in Dublin – general

- <u>Airlink 747 & 757</u> are frequent direct bus services from Dublin Airport (T1 and T2) to the City Centre and main transport hubs.
- <u>Dublin Bus</u> is the biggest public transport provider in the Greater Dublin Area operating over 136 routes. Normal services run from 5.00am until midnight.
- <u>Luas</u> is Dublin's tram service, operating two lines. The Luas Red Line links Tallaght / Saggart to
 Connolly / The Point. The Luas Green Line links Brides Glen / Sandyford to St. Stephen's Green. Luas
 Cross city links the Green and Red Line
- <u>DART</u> is a rail line that runs regularly along the coast from Malahide or Howth in North Co. Dublin southwards through the city centre and as far as Greystones, Co. Wicklow.
- <u>Commuter Rail</u> operates on two lines. One is from Connolly Station in the city to Kilcock. The other is from Heuston Station to Sallins.

By car - For real time travel information and traffic forecast visit www.bison-fute.equipement.gouv.fr
Speed is limited to 50 Km/h in town, 90 Km/h out of town and 130 Km/h on motorways. Parking in the city centre is expensive and hard to find. Places to look for free spaces include the side streets north of the Musée d'Art Contemporain and west of the Jardin Public. Many hotels provide parking for a set price per night. There are large parking lots to the north of esplanade des Quinconces and opposite place de la Bourse. Seatbelts are obliged by law for all passengers. In towns, parking is controlled and must be paid for. Automatic toll payment is an ideal solution, for both frequent and occasional motorway users. <u>Bordeaux Metropole City Pass</u> - For those who wish to make the most of their stay, the Bordeaux Metropole Citypass is really the best! It is available for 24, 48 or 72 consecutive hours.

<u>By Bus</u> - buses to places all over the Gironde leave from the Halte Routière allèes de Chartres (in the northeast corner of Esplanade des Quinconces). Citrame Aquitane runs most buses to destinations in the Gironde and has an information kiosk at the Halte Routière. Other carriers are located opposite the train station.

The **Bordeaux Découverte card**, available at the tourist office, allows unlimited travel for a number of days on buses and trams. Bordeaux's urban buses are run by CGFTE and the company has information/ticket offices at the train station on rue Georges Bonnac. It's best to discover the old quarter, Vieux Bordeaux, on foot. Getting around is easy with the modern-design tramway which runs all along the quays, plus there is an attractive car-free zone.

By coach - The first Sunday of every month (except in the summer) is a traffic-free Sunday and a program of events is organised in the town-centre. Bordeaux is always happy to welcome tourist coaches and in order to improve facilities for them has just opened a special coach-park (fee-paying) in the town-centre. The coach-park, which is situated on the Esplanade des Quinconces (access via "les allées de Bristol"), is open 24 hours a day and there is no time-limit for parking. In addition to this main facility, there are now set down/pick up areas in the vicinity of the hypercentre, on the left bank, and also on the right bank. As some streets are extremely narrow and there are also various traffic restrictions in operation, recommended routes for coaches have been drawn up.
