Mission: To change lives by creating access to sail training voyages for young people from all backgrounds and with all abilities on the island of Ireland.




#### Trainee Recruitment

#### The Numbers

- A total of 48 trainees from the NEIC went on 7 ships from 68 initial applications received.
- 25 male and 23 female trainees.
- Range in age from 18 71!
- ► The trainees were nominated by 14 local organisations. These were from diverse organisations such as Youth Clubs, Community Groups, Addiction Recovery services, HSE Social Workers, Homeless Charity, Unemployment Groups, Garda Diversion Projects, Community Garden Group.
- In addition to the NEIC trainees, three Wheelchair users participated in the regatta onboard the fully accessible Tall Ship Lord Nelson.

# THE TALL SHIPS

### Summary

- 7 primary schools with 1300 children
- 2 secondary schools with 500 children
- 4 care homes
- 2 museums
