1. I declare that I am duly qualified and hold all necessary certificates to enable me to command the sail training vessel named above as a participant in the Race and/or Cruise-in-Company and that, if required by the laws of the country in which it is registered or has its home port, my vessel is legally licensed and insured to sail with trainees and take part in all programmed activities whether in port or at sea (including racing).
2. I confirm that I have received a copy of Tall Ships Races International Limited Racing and Sailing Rules and Special Regulations 2019 Edition, which I have read and understood and that I, my vessel and crew, comply in all respects with those Rules and will continue to do so throughout the Race Series.
3. I have carried out an inspection of the life saving appliances on board my vessel and am satisfied that all such equipment as specified in the above report is available and in proper working order.
4. I declare that my vessel is seaworthy and that the stability characteristics of are appropriate for the sea areas and season in which the Race will take place.
5. I acknowledge that visits by a representative of Tall Ships Races International Ltd (Race Official) in regard to this Vessel Life Saving Appliance Check List are only ensuring that participants comply with the Special Regulations and the Race Officials or representatives of Tall Ships Races International Ltd do not have any liability or responsibility for the fitness for purpose or performance of any safety or other equipment on board the vessel. I understand that Tall Ships Races International Ltd and their agents are not responsible for the seaworthiness of, or in any respect of any incident to, the vessel entered and that all on board will take part in the race at their own risk and responsibility.
6. The decision to start and continue a Tall Ships Races International Limited Race or Cruise-in-Company organised by Tall Ships Races International Ltd is entirely mine; my vessel will not start or continue with the Race or Cruise-in-Company unless I am completely satisfied that the vessel and the crew are fit to do so.
7. I understand that the Race Committee may not permit my vessel to take part in the Race or Cruise-in-Company if they in their absolute discretion consider my vessel or its crew not fit to take part in a Race or Cruise-in-Company for any reason whatsoever and that the Race Committee shall not be obliged to give any reason for their decision.
8. I agree that in any dispute or matter relating to the Race or Cruise-in-Company, the decision of Tall Ships Races International Ltd or the Race Committee appointed by them, shall be final.
9. I confirm that no one under the age of 15 years of age will be on board, as required by Rule 1.3.

# ANNEX

## Guidelines for the Inspection of Life Saving Appliances

- 1 **It is the responsibility of the Captain/Master of each vessel to ensure that all necessary and appropriate life-saving appliances are on board, in date (where appropriate) and in good working order.**
- 2 All vessels participating in any part of a Tall Ships Race (Europe) Ltd event may be required to produce their Life Saving Appliances to verify that these items are on board and, where appropriate, in date. The Tall Ships Races International Ltd Race Official may also request that other items identified in the Tall Ships Races International Limited Racing & Sailing Rules and Special Regulations 2019 Edition are on board, but any such inspection shall not in any way absolve the Captain/Master of the vessel from his responsibilities as stated above.
- 3 The Captain/Master of each participating vessel report that the vessel is ready for inspection to the Race Office as soon as he/she is satisfied that his/her vessel complies with the Special Regulations. Please refer to page 1 (and Rule 12.2) for the relevant deadlines. **It is not required to fill out the form beforehand.**
- 4 Once informed that the vessel is ready for inspection, a Race Official will arrange with the Captain/Master to visit the vessel to ensure that all necessary and appropriate life-saving appliances are on board, in date (where appropriate) and in good working order.
- 5 Should the Race Official have a language difficulty with the Captain/Master or his representative, a request will be made for the designated English-speaking crew member to be present.
- 6 Note that terrestrial mobile telephones **will not be** accepted as alternative means of communication in place of the emergency antennae referred to in Special Rule 3.07 (due to their limited range offshore).
- 7 During the inspection the Race Official will indicate on the page reserved for RACE OFFICIAL'S COMMENTS any Life Saving Appliances which he/she has noted as missing or in any way unsatisfactory. This page will then be signed by the Captain/Master or first mate and witnessed by the Race Official's signature.
- 8 On completion of the inspection, the vessel will be either "satisfactory" or "unsatisfactory". Deficiencies identified in items other than Life Saving Appliances will normally result in a recommendation to the Captain/Master, but multiple deficiencies may result in the Race Official recommending to the Race Committee that the vessel should not be permitted to participate in the event for which it was inspected.
- 9 Where a Race Official has made comments in relation to Life-Saving Appliances or any other items, the Captain/Master should request a re-inspection (at a time to be agreed with the Inspector) as soon as the identified deficiencies have been rectified. Refer to Rule 12.2 for the deadline for re-inspection.
- 10 Once designated "satisfactory" the VLSA Check List will normally remain valid for the entire Race Series. However, should there be a change of Captain/Master, the replacement should visit the Race Office to read and sign the Master's Declaration on page 6.
- 11 **Deadlines and penalties for submitting the VLSA Check List, and re-inspections (if applicable), are listed in Rule 12.2**
