Description of Position	Challenge Wales is an award-winning charity that changes the lives of young people and the charity is now looking for someone with an eye for maintenance and the passion to help young people achieve their potential through sail training and big boat adventures. The charity operates 72-foot Challenge Wales and 60-foot Adventure Wales. The role will start in March 2020 and finish October 2020 with potential to extend. Purpose of the Role: The Mate is a key role supporting and assisting the Skipper in delivering the youth and adult sailing programme of Challenge Wales as well as running the maintenance programme with the Skipper. The Mate is required to live onboard the vessel during the normal operational season. As crew on Challenge Wales is made up of volunteers, the Mate will also be required to supervise volunteers during any refit/maintenance programme as well as work with the Youth Development Officer to deliver the Charity's youth development (accredited) programme. The successful candidate will also provide continuity between the charity and the volunteer crew.		

Tasks & Responsibilities

- Safely navigating and operating the vessel under the direction of the Skipper
- Assisting the Skipper in passage planning
- Assisting the Skipper with ensuring the vessel and its equipment are maintained in a safe and seaworthy condition at all times and in accordance with Challenge Wales' Planned Maintenance Programme
- Taking over from the Skipper should he/she be incapacitated
- Supporting the skipper with safety, discipline, morale and welfare of volunteers and clients
- Managing food rotation and victualling and following Challenge Wales' financial and purchasing procedures
- Co-ordinating any feedback paperwork as well as funding specific paperwork (e.g. equality /outcome wheel's)
- Running the deck in a Mate role and leading young people and clients in sailing tasks
- Leading tasks linked to national accreditation as guided/supported by Youth Development Officer, including environmental focussed activities and ensuring the right resources are onboard at the right time
- Operating the tender
- Helping to deliver RYA courses (Start Yachting, Competent Crew, Watchleader, Sailability) and be familiar with the RYA syllabus
- Be able to lead games onboard to help boost morale
- Liaise with the Skipper and Youth Development Officer for a debrief after each voyage
- Ability to use own initiative and see things that need to be done onboard
- Championing the brand and raising the profile of the charity

The above list is not intended to be comprehensive but the postholder will be expected to be flexible in carrying out tasks related to the role.

The Mate has a responsibility to continue to develop their skills in navigation, sailing, maintenance and understanding of systems onboard.

- Have experience of sailing vessels of similar size to Challenge Wales vessels
- Good leadership skills and ability to lead in a positive way
- Have the ability to work on their own initiative
- Be energetic enthusiastic, hands-on, proactive and willing to work hard
- Can bring their own ideas to the charity to create new opportunities (shore-side and/or onboard) and strengthen the Challenge Wales sail training programme.
- Possess very good communication skills both verbal and written, be compassionate and able to understand the needs of
