- STI HOST PORT CONTRACT CHANGES & OTHER INITIATIVES

HOST PORT CONTRACT CHANGES

- Increased freedom for ports and ships to find the best "commercial fit"
- Host ports are now required to commit to funding a minimum of 100 local young trainees to take part in the TSR the year they are hosting
- Host ports are also required to undertake a wider marketing campaign to attract local young trainees who do not need funding
- + We have been working with our Youth Council to explore how we can widen the net of young people to take in the TSR. We are reviewing branding, target audiences and channels, messaging, etc.





Our proposal

A new standard plan for port days









After arrival:

- → Crew Parade
- → Trainee farewell dinner

Before departure:

- → Familiarisation trainees/crew, safety briefing, rig training and preparations for the voyage
- → All trainees on board in due time



STADSRAAD LEHMKUHL

- Fully booked with trainees for all legs
- Some ports were better than others
- 46,811 visitors visited the ship in the 5 ports
- Fredrikstad offered them the same deal as in 2019, which worked really well
- Lerwick was able to arrange an alcohol licence so that they could sell drinks on board & included them in their cultural programme by having music and choirs on board
- They were able to sell food, drink and souvenirs on board
- Arendal was excellent in terms of helping to generate income and made it a real success
- In addition to trainees, total income was
 1.1m NK (= approx. 85,000 Euros)

- Sponsor benefit packages 11 corporate deck hires
- Deck Hire sales 6 private bookings
- Income of £36,673 for eight ships
- Alternative arrangement Statsraad Lehmkuhl
 - **Public Bar**
 - 10,485 visitors
 - Retained all income





Reflections and Future Planning

- Deck hires challenging but still valuable
- Consider self-generated income solutions for ships
- Bespoke, tailored options for sma ller ships


