Stavanger is the fourth largest city in Norway with 151,000 citizens, and our third largest urban area.

In 2025 we celebrated the 900th anniversary for Stavanger city, the cathedral and the diocese. Our long tradition as a port for sailors covers the ages from the time of the Vikings to the present. Stavanger is one of the oldest cities in Norway, founded when the cathedral was built in 1125. 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2.4 Arrival Procedures

All vessels with a maximum length of 24 metres or more must contact Kvitsøy VTS when approaching the coastline, as described in section 2.3 and in accordance with the applicable regulations:

ETA Stavanger must be reported to Stavanger Port Authority – Port Operations Office – and the Technical Help Desk at least 24 hours prior to arrival.

When passing Tungenes point, all vessels must contact Stavanger Port Authority (VHF channel 12) for berth and mooring instructions.

2.5 Pilots

Pilots are provided free of charge for vessels participating in The Tall Ships Races where pilotage is compulsory in accordance with applicable regulations.

Generally, pilotage is compulsory for vessels of 70 metres or more in length, vessels with a beam of 20 metres or more, and passenger vessels of 50 metres or more carrying passengers.

2.6 Tugs

Tug assistance, if required and pre-ordered, will be provided free of charge as described below.

Requests for tug assistance must be sent to maritim@stavanger.havn.no no later than 48 hours prior to arrival.

The following tug and manoeuvring assistance resources will be available during the periods indicated below:

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Tananger (arrival):

1 RIB with pushing capacity of approx. 1 tonne

Stavanger (arrival and departure):

2 RIBs with pushing capacity of approx. 1 tonne each

1 tug with a capacity of 4 tonnes

1 tug with a capacity of 3 tonnes

During manoeuvring operations, sailing vessels may be instructed to switch to dedicated working channels on VHF.

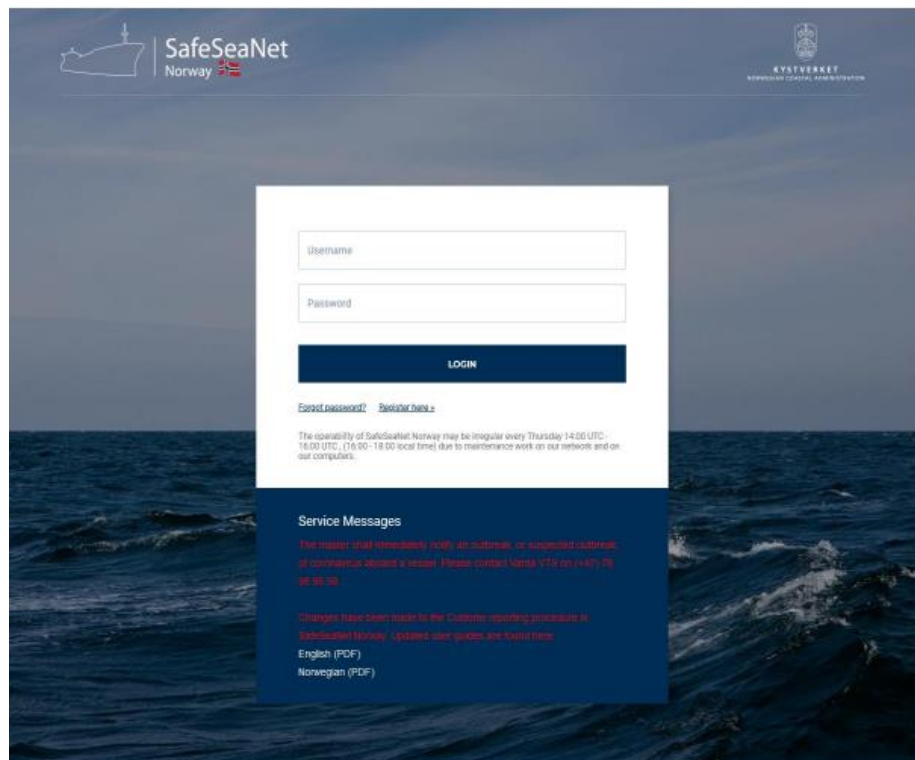
SafeSeaNet Norway

2.8 Security & Port Regulations

Ships participating in the Tall Ships Races (TSR) are granted exemption from quay dues. Otherwise, standard terms and conditions apply.

Please also note that vessels with an ISSC are required to exchange a Declaration of Security (DoS) with the Port of Stavanger.

2.9 Fenders & Gangways

All vessels are expected to provide their own fenders and gangways. The quays are equipped with truck tyre fendering.

If additional fenders or gangways are required, please contact our Technical Help Desk at least one week prior to arrival. The vessel must specify requirements regarding dimensions and type. The Technical Help Desk will assess what can be arranged in advance.

2.10 Pollution

All vessels must comply with applicable international and national regulations regarding pollution prevention.

Discharge of oil, chemicals, sewage, garbage or any other pollutants into the harbour or sea area is prohibited.

In case of any pollution incident, the vessel must immediately notify the Port of Stavanger via VHF channel 12 or telephone +47 51 50 12 01 (24/7).

2.11 Departure

To facilitate departure for the Tall Ships Parade, all ships are requested to berth as shown in the departure plan to be available before arriving in Stavanger. Most ships will be turned upon arrival, i.e. bow heading out of harbour.

3 BERTHING

3.1 Special Berthing Instructions

Berths have been arranged and assigned in advance for all participating ships. Please see the attached mooring plan.

When passing Tungenes point, all vessels must contact the Port of Stavanger on VHF channel 12.

The harbour will be open for participating TSR vessels from Wednesday 22 July at 08:00 LT. The Port of Stavanger encourages vessels to arrive between 08:00 and 12:00 LT that day.

If a vessel intends to arrive one day earlier, a berth must be requested from the Maritime Department at the Port of Stavanger by email to maritim@stavanger.havn.no. Requests must be submitted at least 24 hours prior to arrival.

3.2 Formalities

Dress Ship: All participating ships are kindly requested to dress ship overall (rainbow fashion) during the stay in Stavanger (weather permitting).

Colours: From 08:00 to 21:00 hours.

3.3 Berthing plan

Please see the attached berthing plan. The plan is subject to change.

3.4 Ship Opening Hours

All A and B class vessels are encouraged to open their ships to the public during the event. Suggested hours are between 10:00 and 21:00 Wednesday, Thursday and Friday.

Vessels offering deck visits should ensure a safe gangway with sufficient load-bearing capacity and railings on both sides.

3.5 Day Sailing

All vessels exceeding 24 metres in length must obtain clearance from Kvitsøy VTS on VHF channel 18 prior to departure from berth.

Mooring personnel must be ordered at least 1 hour prior to departure via Port of Stavanger on VHF channel 12 or by telephone +47 51 50 12 01 (24/7).

3.6 Deck Receptions

Ships open to deck receptions should forward their reception details to Stavanger project management via post@tallships.no as soon as possible. Details should include capacity on and below deck, price structure, catering details/menus and other relevant information – and contact details.

3.7 Farewell greeting Friday evening 24 July

As a farewell greeting to host port Stavanger, all ships are asked to sound their horns and whistles after the end of the farewell concert, at approximately 22:30 Friday 24 July.

The lovely Bjergsted park is the ideal location for the Stavanger crew party. Dress up, bring your best party spirit, and join us for an unforgettable evening with music, games, delicious food, refreshing drinks and an open bar.

Admission is restricted to those wearing Tall Ships Races 2026 wristband and Crew Party wristband: White (under 18) and blue (over 18) with food (1) and drink (2 and 3) tokens.

Please note that there will be strict regulations on alcohol in line with Norwegian legislation. Alcohol will be available for purchase only for those able to prove that they are over 18 years old. Bringing your own alcoholic drinks to the party is not allowed.

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Crew Party regulations:

- ONLY crew with Tall Ships Races 2026 wristband AND Crew Party wristband will be allowed into the party area.
- Crew without both wristbands when in the party area will be asked to leave immediately.
- Anyone over 18 supplying alcohol to under 18s or anyone under 18 drinking alcohol in the party area will be asked to leave immediately.
- Crew over 18 will have to show Crew Party wristband and ID to be served any alcohol.

8 LIAISON SYSTEM

8.1 Explanation

A Liaison organisation has been set up for visiting ships. Shortly after your arrival at your assigned berth, your Liaison Officer (LO) will meet you. Each ship will have a designated LO who will assist you throughout your stay in Stavanger. The LOs will be in uniform or wearing yellow T-shirts marked 'Liaison Officer'.

A team of Crew Friends (CF) will assist the Liaison Officers. The CFs know the city and the region and will accompany visiting trainees to the various activities they will participate in whilst ashore. CFs will be uniformed in red T-shirts marked 'Crew Friend'. Most CFs are young people, and some are previous trainees or will be sailing as trainees from Stavanger.

9 SHIP SERVICES

The Technical Help Desk will be your “one-stop shop” for all requirements for bunkering, stores, supplies, repairs etc. Services to be ordered on separate forms via tsrhelpdesk2026@marlog.no or in some cases via the Liaison Officer.

To receive any delivery, someone holding a major credit card must be available on board.

Payment will always be requested prior to delivery.

9.1 Fuel

Large volumes (more than 10,000 litres) must be ordered upon departure from Antwerp.

Fuel **orders for more than 1000 litres** MGO are preferably to be ordered by email **prior to arrival in Stavanger**. Orders to be sent by email to tsrhelpdesk2026@marlog.no.

At the very latest, order forms must be delivered to the Liaison Officer upon arrival in Stavanger.

To order: Use electronic order form and coordinate through your Liaison Officer.

Diesel will be delivered by truck Friday 24 July between 06:00 and 10:00 LT.

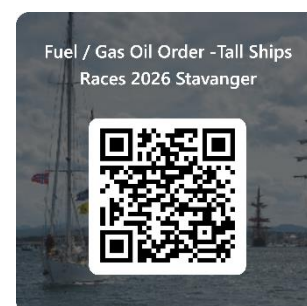
For diesel or petrol needs less than 1000 litres, ships are kindly asked to use nearby bunkering facilities as described below.

Ship's crew is responsible for fuelling and must assure no spillage.

Only major credit cards will be accepted.

9.2 Fresh Water

Water posts with hoses, for self-service, will be available along the quayside. Water supply is free of charge.

9.3 Electricity

Already specified by each ship on signing up for The Tall Ships Races 2026 via STI (ref. Data Sheet).

If any changes to these specifications, notice must be sent by email to tsrhelpdesk2026@marlog.no minimum one week prior to arrival Stavanger.

C and D class vessels berthed in the Børevigå Marina connect to the marina's power columns using access code 5473#.

Electrical power supply is free of charge.

9.4 Tank Emptying

Orders must be submitted by email to tsrhelpdesk2026@marlog.no no later than 48 hours prior to arrival.

Tank emptying will be carried out by truck on Friday 24 July between 06:00 and 09:00 LT.

Volume and a waste declaration must be submitted in advance.

Vessels delivering larger quantities may be subject to charges. Any such charges are to be agreed in advance at the time of ordering.

9.5 Waste

Ships participating in The Tall Ships Races may deliver a maximum of 0.5 m³ of segregated waste per 24-hour period to the environmental stations located along the quay.

Waste must be delivered to the designated waste stations in the quay area, which are divided into the following categories:

- General waste
- Glass/metal
- Paper/cardboard
- Mixed plastics

The environmental stations will be emptied daily between 06:00 and 10:00 LT.

Food waste and other waste categories, as well as larger quantities of waste, must be ordered separately. Collection will be carried out by truck directly from the gangway, no later than 10:00 LT on Thursday 23 July.

Requests must be submitted at least 48 hours prior to arrival by email to tsrhelpdesk2026@marlog.no. The type and quantity of waste must be specified when placing the order.

Vessels delivering larger quantities of waste may be subject to charges. Any such charges are to be agreed in advance at the time of ordering.

9.6 Gas (propane)

Gas bottles will be refilled free of charge Friday and Saturday mornings.

The empty propane gas bottles must be marked with the ship's name and phone number, then placed on the quay by the gangway for collection at 06:00 LT on Friday and/or Saturday.

The bottles will be filled and returned to the ship before 10:00 LT the same day.

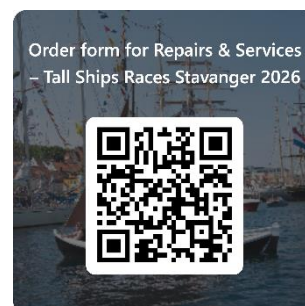


9.7 Repairs

All orders must be received by no later than Tuesday 21 July at 15:00 LT and will be delivered Thursday or Friday morning between 06:00 and 10:00 LT.

Please note: There is a minimum of two days' delivery time.

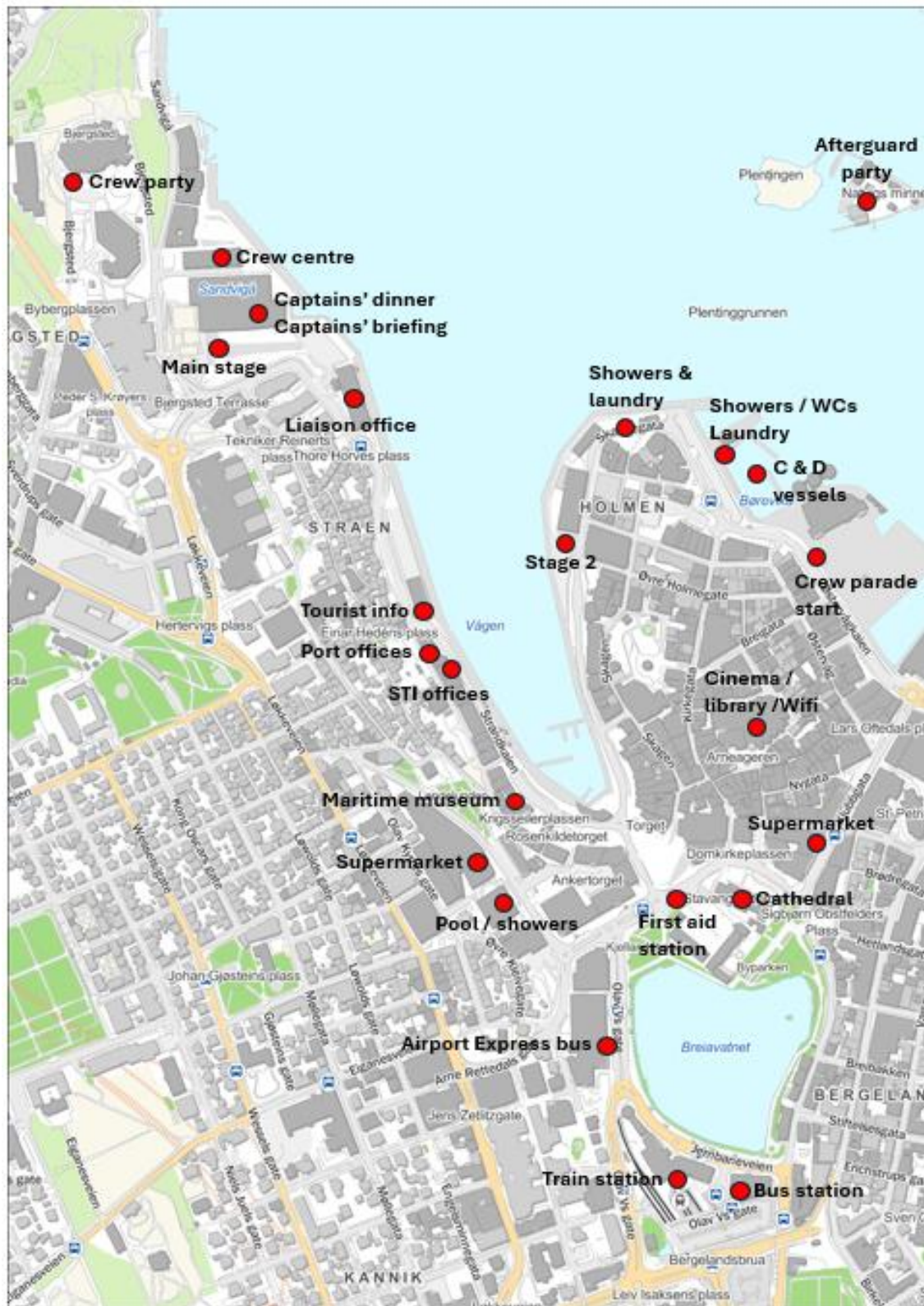

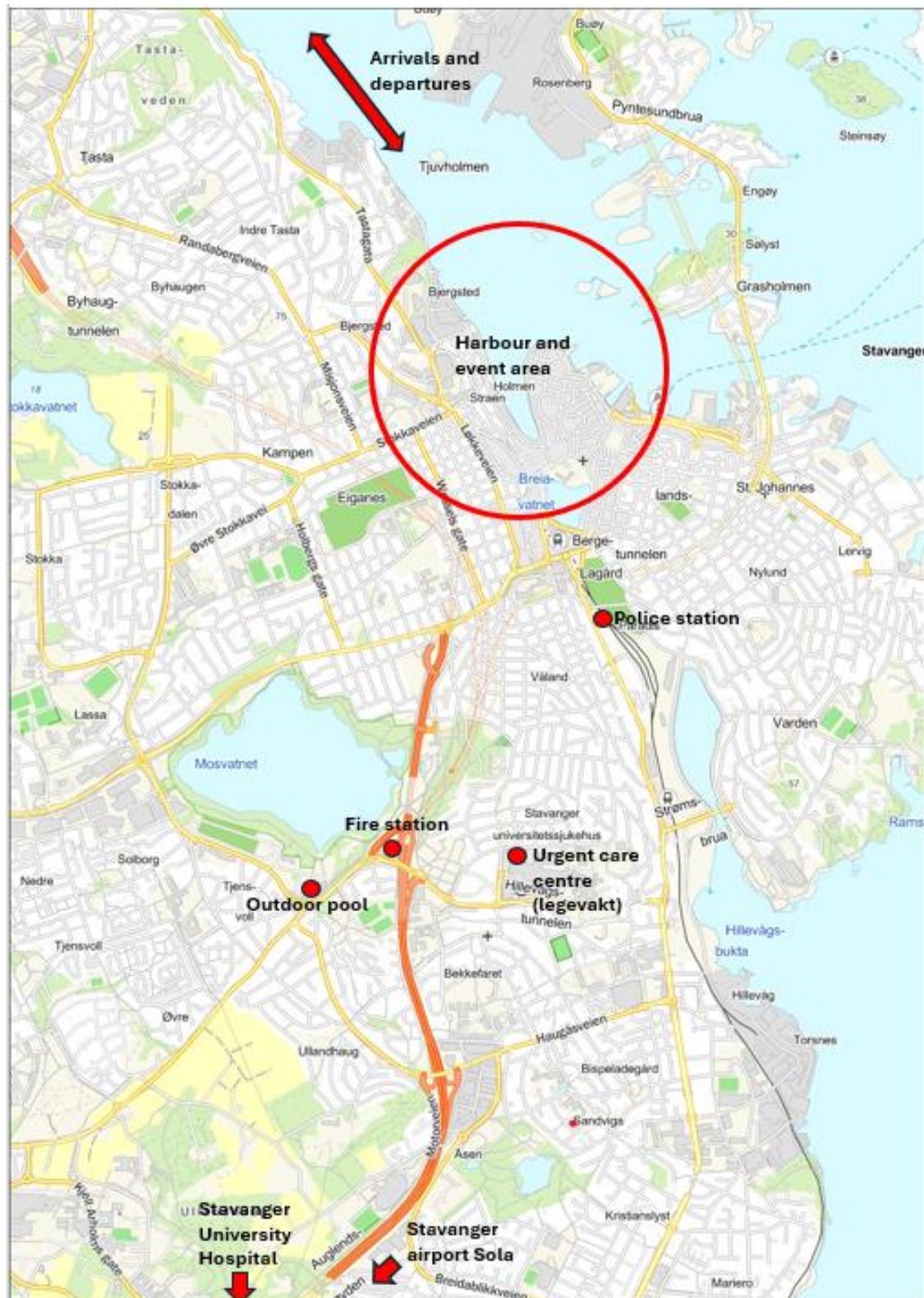

HARBOUR AND EVENT AREA MAP

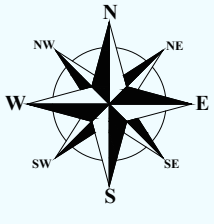


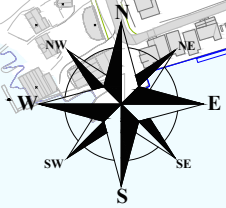
